### October is Cybersecurity Month

October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month, and it's a great time for everyone to refamiliarize themselves with ways to reduce your risk of becoming an online victim. Here are some tips from our nation's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) on ways you can guard yourself against cyber threats:

#### Don't get "phished in."

Phishing scams often use legitimate-looking emails, websites and online forms to trick you into divulging personal information. Remember that legitimate businesses, like Hawaii State FCU, will NEVER call, text or email members asking for sensitive information, including social security numbers, passwords, account credentials or PIN codes.

#### Beef up your passwords.

Reduce your risk by using strong passwords. A general rule would be to use a unique password that is at least 16 characters long, random and unique for each account. Including upper and lower case letters, numbers and symbols can also help strengthen your passwords.

#### Use multi-factor authentication.

Multi-factor authentication (MFA) provides extra security for online accounts and apps. Examples of MFA include receiving a special code via text, or a prompt to use face ID before allowing a login.

#### Stay up-to-date.

Keeping your software and operating systems upto-date is one of the best ways to reduce your risk of becoming a cyber victim. These updates often contain important security patches to protect you from potential vulnerabilities.

Never share your personal information, including account numbers, passwords, PINs, debit/credit card numbers, or your Social Security Number with anyone who contacts you requesting it. If you receive a suspicious communication from someone saying they're from Hawaii State FCU, do not respond or click on any links. Review your account activity and contact us immediately if you spot anything suspicious.

## Ali'i Branch Closing November 15

After nearly 20 years serving the downtown Honolulu area, we will be closing our Ali'i Branch on Alakea Street and transitioning services right down the street to our Headquarters Branch, beginning Monday, November 18, 2024.

With many of our members now visiting our flagship branch at 333 Queen Street, and with the addition of our Hawaii State Investment Services Center next door, the decision was made to consolidate our downtown services to our Headquarters location. Our Ali'i branch will permanently close on Friday, November 15, 2024 at 5 p.m. Rest assured our Ali'i team members will all be transitioning to new roles at other branch locations or departments within the organization, with several familiar faces remaining downtown at our Headquarters Branch.

The ATM at Ali'i Branch will no longer be available after the closure, however our Headquarters Branch offers a 24/7 ITM near the member entrance on Queen Street. HSFCU members may also enjoy surcharge-free withdrawals at any Bank of Hawaii ATM.
